Opening the "Vault"

There's a great line from a hymn text that is often sung during the Easter season. In our ELW hymnals, it's #367: *Now all the vault of heav'n resounds in praise of love that still abounds: "Christ has triumphed! He is living!"*

Do you remember how at the beginning of the Lenten season we sealed up a certain word in the tomb, you know—that really joyously exclamatory word?! Well, it's almost time to let it out! During Lent we symbolically sealed it up in the tomb; we omitted it from all songs and liturgy. We purposefully put it away to experience the solemnity of God's gift of Christ's sacrifice. We set it apart in order to make it even more special the next time we use it.

Have you noticed any other things "missing" from the worship during the Lenten season?

- ✠ The hymn of praise (the song sung just before the prayer of the day) is omitted from both worships; we only sing the penitential Kyrie during Lent.
- ✠ Flower arrangements are not ordered or displayed behind the altar.
- ✠ At the 11:00 worship during Lent, the psalm is spoken instead of sung as in other seasons of the church year.
- ✠ Perhaps some of you have practiced fasting or have given up something for Lent.

Each of these things that we have gone without during the Lenten season will now return full of Easter triumph and Easter joy, and we, being full of thankfulness and amazement of what God has done (and is doing) for us, will be unable to contain it in the vault any longer. As we enter into worship the morning of Sunday, April 4th to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord, let our mouths open and burst forth with praises to our Risen King!

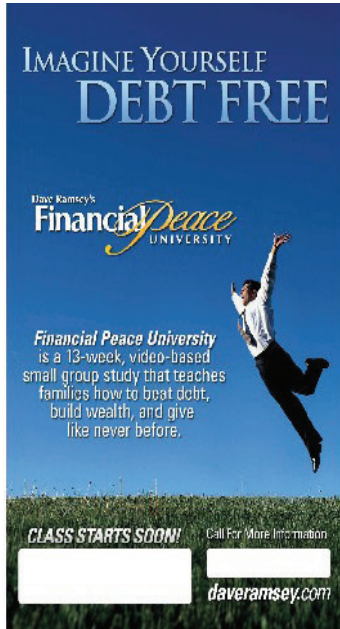

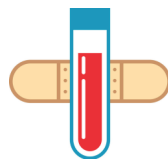

I'd like to take the time to share some insight I've gained over the past couple years as an attending and practicing member. We've all spent many hours in Sunday School, listening to lessons, hearing sermons, and experienced several campaigns. One key message is that God has called us all to be Christians. To do better. To do right by Christ.

Over the past year, I've started to pray each morning to be a better Steward, to be a better disciple, to be a better evangelist promoting God's will with Jesus as my teacher. While serving on the council for my third year, and as council president, I ask for guidance often. Fortunately I have a wonderful group of peers I look to and lean on for advice. Memorial Garden/Columbarium to be studied

An idea originally spawned during the creation of a master plan for expansion of the church building may become a reality if a study group concludes favorable results.

The idea for the creation of a Memorial Garden was originally recommended by a design team made up of two church council members Phil Fleming and Dan Stamm. The church council accepted their recommendation as part of the plans for the overall construction of the expanded fellowship hall and sanctuary.

At that time it was visualized that the garden would be located on the grounds outside the north wall of the sanctuary and near the west entrance of the Fellowship Hall. It was only recently that the idea of such a garden surfaced again. This time it was during a discussion involving cremation. A thought was voiced to see if a Columbarium might be constructed as part of the garden. A Columbarium is a burial structure for a deceased person's cremated remains.

The idea of a Memorial Garden and Columbarium was then presented to the Worship Team at the church and it was decided that a special group be formed to study such the possible addition. In looking into the idea it has been pointed out that for centuries, it has been the obligation of the church to serve its congregation from baptism to death. Although earth burial on church grounds is no longer feasible for most churches, the desire to continue this sacred rite still remains.

Establishing a Columbarium at the church will revive the critical ministry of offering a rightful place at the church for those members seeking final homecoming. It also comforts the living with the knowledge that the Memorial Garden can be visited anytime to remember loved ones or offer quiet prayers. Furthermore, special worship services are also possible to honor those individuals whose remains are resting in the garden.

The rate of cremation in the US is growing each year. Many Christians choose cremation as a most economical way after death so their passing does not become a burden on their children or relatives. Memorial gardens, featuring a Columbarium, are growing in popularity nationally and locally. The study team hopes to visit several sites at other Lutheran churches in the Raleigh as well as one at another church in the Fuquay-Varina. Meanwhile, another local church is also beginning to look into establishing a Columbarium.

Members interested in serving on the team are asked to contact Phil Fleming as the team is now being formed.



Shown here is just one example of how a Memorial Garden and Columbarium might look when interwoven together. The team hopes to also make recommendations as to what layout that might be used to create such an addition at APLC as well as what design the Columbarium.
